Written Expression and Grammar

[ESL Gold](#) has a strong webpage on the kinds of grammar you will need for the TOEFL ITP.

The site toefl-itp has [8 sample tests](#) from the written expression and grammar sections.

Quizlet is a site that provides review and definitions of [grammar terms](#) you might find on the Written Expression section. They have free flashcards with definitions, and also have a great Scatter review game and quizzes to practice your knowledge quickly.

Listening

In the United States, National Public Radio, or NPR, is a solid website with daily national and international stories. You can listen to any story at their weekday program [All Things Considered](#).

Youtube provides a number of short videos for you to [practice listening samples](#) for the TOEFL.

[VOANews Special English](#) is a daily source of mp3 format news stories, to practice listening comprehension.



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Reading and Vocabulary

Reading a daily newspaper online is very useful. Consider the [Arab News](#) or [Saudi Gazette](#). Both contain well-written articles on current national and international issues.

The Voice of America (VOA) has a special "[Learning English](#)" site that contains current news stories you can read and listen to.

[Breaking News English](#) uses current news stories for you to practice reading, guessing words from context, and improving your vocabulary. They also have mp3 downloads at varying speeds to improve your listening comprehension.
